International Tolly Club Summit - January 28-30, 2023 – Astoria, Oregon

Sandra Lewis from the Canadian group did a wonderful job of preparing a slide showing Tolly events and the various years that Tolly made boats – from beginning to end. We visited the show, then took a break before lunch to visit the Marine Museum. We spent about 90 minutes touring the museum, before we gorged ourselves on Genos Pizza (which was delicious!) and salad. We finished lunch with a birthday celebration for Scott Fultz and Tolly with some vanilla and chocolate cake. **Note:** When Sandra Lewis made the slideshow, she showed slides from all three clubs. Lavonne sent her a lot of pictures from our club and she also pulled some from our Facebook site. So Tollycrafters Northwest was well represented. Also, the speakers talked about having the International Tolly gathering once a year (in Astoria, Kalama or Longview), so hopefully we can get more folks from TNW to come next time. Columbia River Maritime Museum Status

Two years ago I transported a number of Tolly items that I had received from Scott Fulz to the museum after having several discussions with the head Curator, Jeff Smith. He told me that within 10 years, the museum hoped to develop an exhibit about northwest boat building. Following our past weekend in Astoria, I recontacted him to see what the status is. Here is what he reported:

The museum staff determined that it was not feasible to put a boat building exhibit in the main museum because there are additional exhibits being developed now so that there would not be room. Staff began discussing the possibility of constructing a new building across the highway, as well as possibly purchasing additional land. For the past year, museum staff has been actively discussing this and is interested in including Tollycraft Yachts in the proposed exhibit. For the next two years, staff will actively investigate the possibilities, do their due diligence, prepare cost estimates, and look for funding sources. At the board meeting in two years, they will present their findings and recommendations to the board for a vote of approval.

Mr. Smith confirmed that the museum has been contacted by a subject who has told them that if they proceed with the new building and include Tollycraft in the exhibit, that he will contribute a substantial sum of money to the project. I know that Scott Fulz has mentioned an amount to several people, but I do not have that sum confirmed by the museum. Jeff said that if things go well, it is conceivable that ground breaking for the new building, if approved, could happen in 2025.

This is great news. Jeff was very pleased to learn about the number of Tolly members who attended last weekend, and about our plan to make it an annual event.
